**Catechism of the Catholic Church** - The catechism is the text which contains the fundamental Christian truths formulated in a way that

facilitates their understanding. There are two categories of catechism: major and minor. A major catechism is a resource or a point of reference for the development of minor catechisms. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is an example of a major catechism. The *Baltimore Catechism* is an example of a minor catechism.
